General Meeting
MAY 10, 1994

The meeting was opened by Vice President, Barbara Davidson, at 7:15 P.M. in the meeting room of the Joint Free Library of Morristown and Morris Township. A Genealogy and Local History Book Fair will be held at the same time cosponsored by the Morris County Heritage Commission. Notices of other meetings will be posted on the bulletin board in the Local History Section of the Library.

A note was received from Joan expressing her thanks for the World Atlas which was presented to her at the last meeting.

Barbara announced a meeting for old and new board members on June fourteenth at 7:30 P.M. in the Treasure Room at the Library.

In answer to a request for an auditor for the books, Melvin Klein volunteered the services of his wife.

The guest speaker for the evening was JoAnn Cotz who showed slides of Seton Hall through the years and explained their archives.
